Important Notes Regarding CAC Images

- ↓ *Color Band and OVD not included during initial Beta Testing (first 50,000 cards issued)*
- ↓ *Without connectivity, temporary CACs will be issued to all recipients without a chip (expire in 10 - 280 days)*
- ↓ *CACs will not be issued to civilian members of the Intelligence Community (not in DEERS)*

PROHIBITION ON COPYING OR DISTRIBUTING SAMPLE CARDS: Title 18, United States Code, section 701 prohibits photographing or otherwise reproducing or possessing departmental identification cards in an unauthorized manner, under penalty of fine or imprisonment or both. Consequently, for purposes related to communication with user communities regarding the new cards within the Department, the CAC shall not be posted or shown on web sites, or shown actual size, it will always be shown with “sample” on it, and the (skeletal) likenesses shown within this document (CAC Policy Memorandum) will be used to the maximum extent possible.





